

DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

The Alberta Emergency Management Act (2013) requires that communities establish an emergency management agency, and appoint a director to oversee the agency's activities. The Director of Emergency Management (DEM) workshop will introduce participants to the role of DEM or Deputy DEM in the context of the Alberta Emergency Management framework. The workshop is intended to develop foundational of knowledge to support those new to the role. Participants will review emergency management principles before being introduced to governing legislation, roles and responsibilities relevant to the DEM position, as well as to examine the contextual elements of leadership that come into play within this critical role.

WORKSHOP OUTCOMES

At the end of the workshop, you will:

OUTCOME 1	Explain the emergency management framework within Alberta.
OUTCOME 2	Describe the Director of Emergency Management (DEM) position in relation to governing legislation.
OUTCOME 3	Compare leadership styles and identify one's contextual preference(s).
OUTCOME 4	Appraise processes for preparing and coordinating community emergency plans and programs.
OUTCOME 5	Explain the tasks and procedures for acting as director of emergency operations on behalf of the emergency management agency.
OUTCOME 6	Summarize the roles and responsibilities for coordinating all emergency resources and services used in an emergency.
OUTCOME 7	Identify other possible DEM duties that could be required by the local authority.
OUTCOME 8	Discuss the cognitive processes that take place under the context of stress and uncertainty.
OUTCOME 9	Analyze the contextual and psychological processes that differentiate "normal" leadership from "crisis and emergency management" forms of leadership.
